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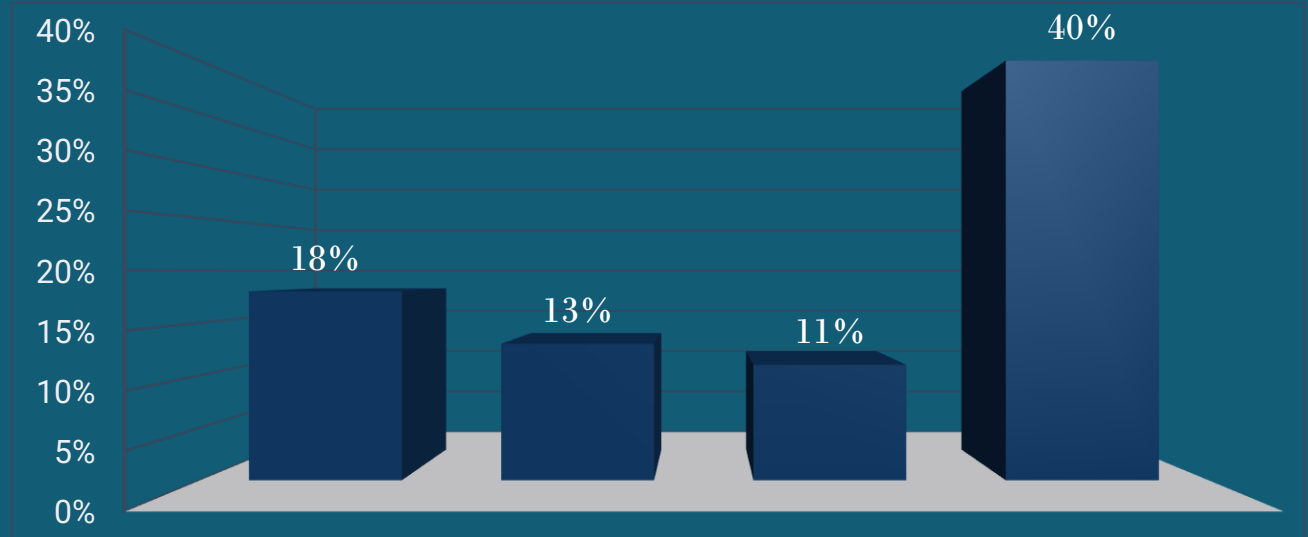
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# FINDING HIGHLIGHTS

Masters of Social Work Students accounted for 40% of all attendees while MSW degree holders accounted for 12%.

Bachelors of Social Work Students accounted for 18% of all attendees and BSW degree holders accounted for another 13% in addition bachelor degree holders from other disciplines, associates degrees, and high school diplomas combined for 11%.



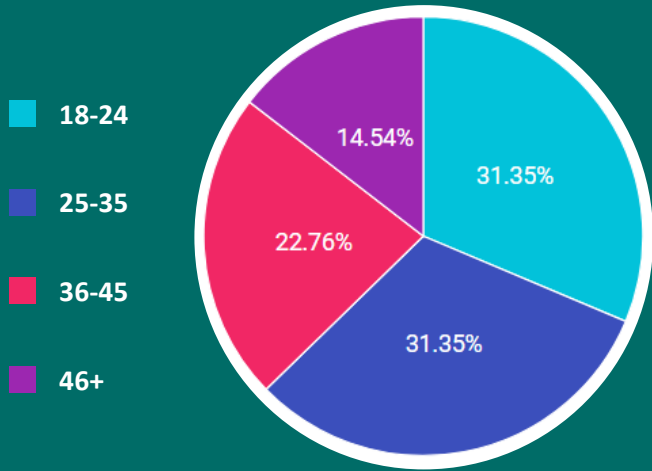
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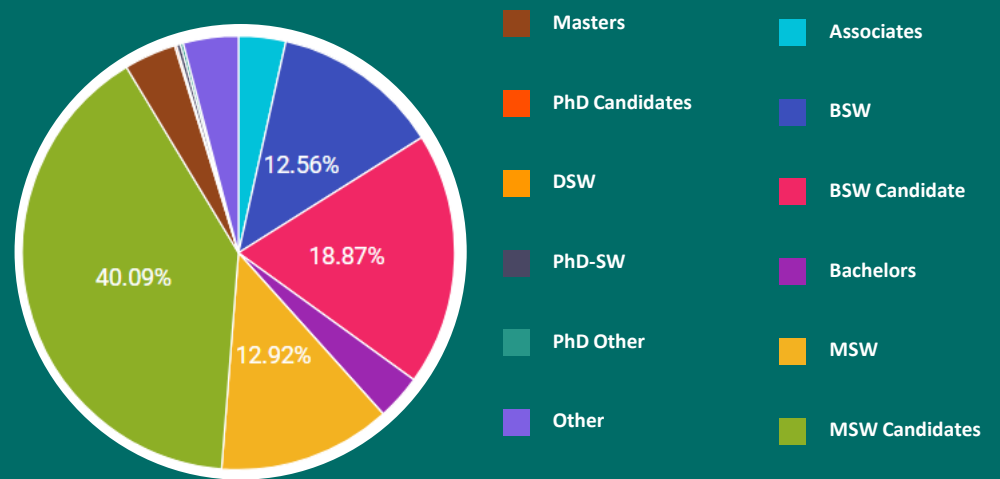

Age Breakdown



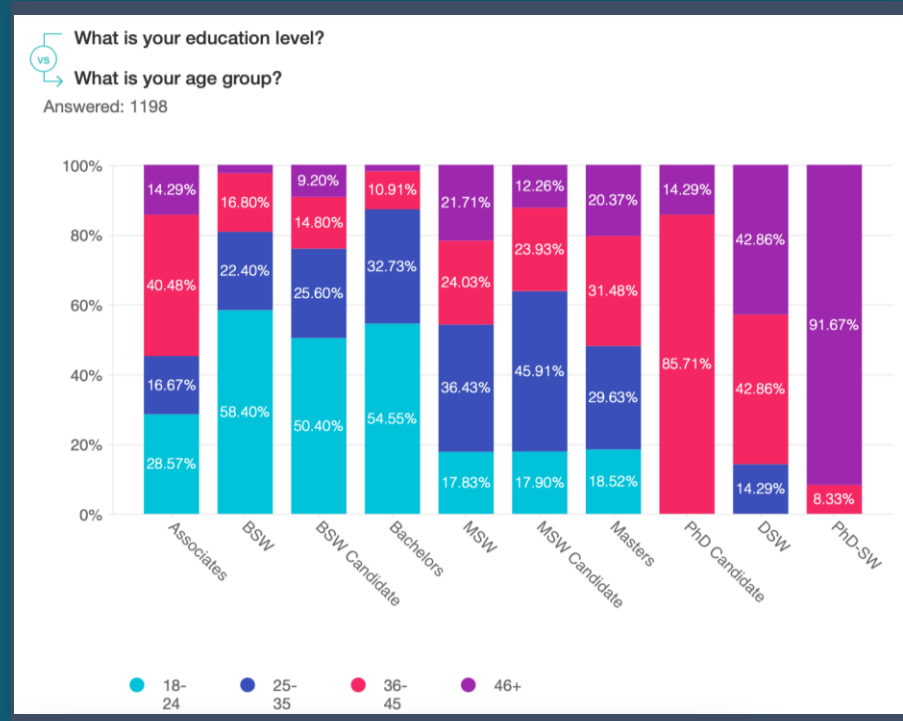

(Day 1)

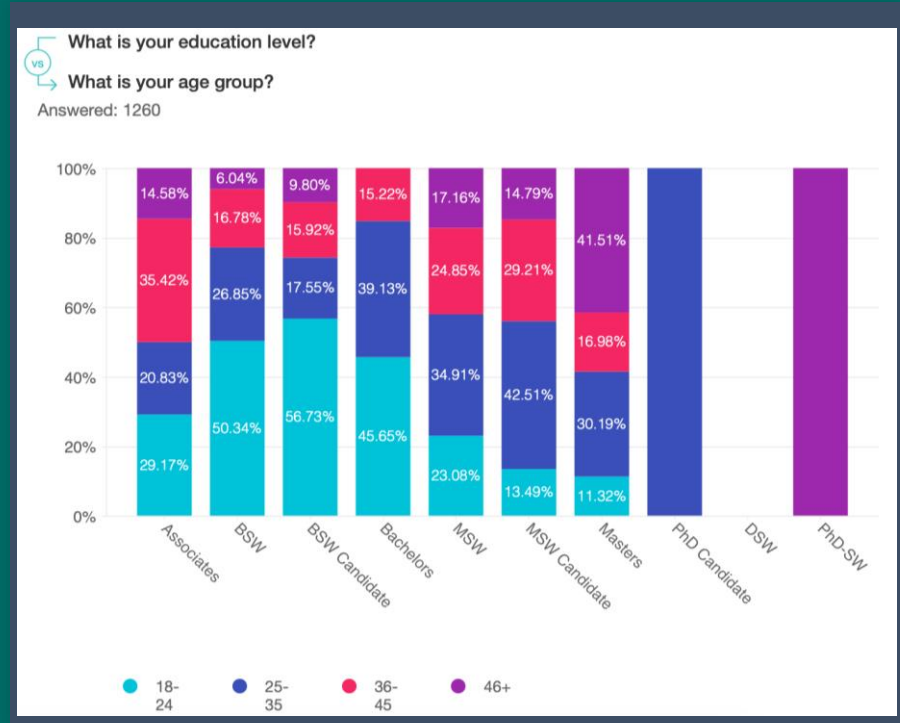

(Day 2)

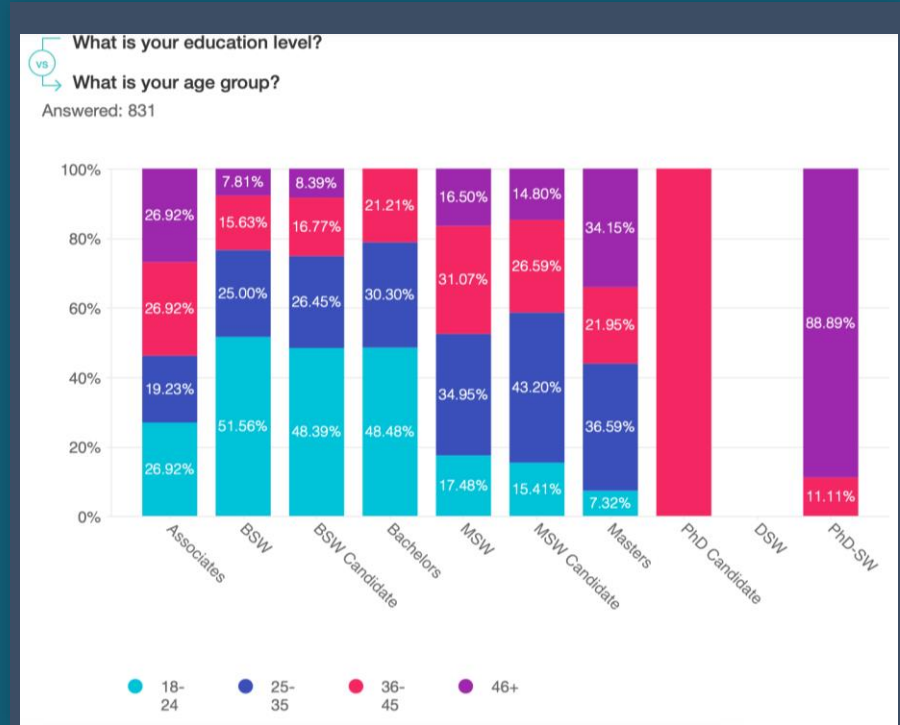
